## Principal's Message

Hello Families and Community Members,

We had a very fun, wet and hula hooping/hoop shooting time at this year's fundraiser Pirate Plunder Party. Students were able to pick up their prizes, and based on the number of items they sold, they were able to shoot basketballs for cash, play bingo, be in the hula hoop contest and water balloon toss and get a Columbia Cougar Pass. Of course, the most fun seemed to be those who participated in the "Flush Mr. Hamilton" activity where I got very wet, the kids had fun and it was a great day for a party. Our fundraiser will net the PTSO about \$8000 to spend on the kids this year.

**Safety** – We have had some issues with adults and our students in the neighborhood. We sent home a letter on Friday, 9-17, addressing a stranger concern. This concern relates to another series of emails and concerns that I have received from parents regarding specifically the stop sign area at the north end of the Columbia campus off of Columbia Avenue and E. Bethany Circle as well as El Dorado Park. We direct students home every day, but we have a handful that loiters daily on the corner and in the park. This is unsafe and sends a negative message to our community regarding middle school student behaviors. Please help us by making sure your student goes directly home every single day unless they are in a school activity/sport supervised by a Columbia staff member. We will be working with district security and the Aurora Police Department to clear these students out of these areas. We have asked, guided and walked these student groups daily with little change in their practice and will address this formally with those families beginning October 1st.

**Tuesday Lessons** – This year we have added a leadership lesson time for 30 minutes to homerooms on Tuesdays. These lessons have included information on bullying, integrity, respect, perseverance and most recently excellence with the presentation of the Presidential address to students around the nation. We are very excited about this time and our plan to bring a formal bullying program to students along with developing our diversity/equity initiative.

**Breakfast** – We began breakfast on September 13th. Doors on the east side of the cafeteria open at 6:50 AM and close at 7:00 AM. Kids can eat from 6:50 to 7:10 AM. Information was sent home via the automated phone message system, newsletters and in the first quarter progress report. Breakfast is NOT served on Tuesdays due to the late start.

**Report Card Envelopes** – Every four and a half weeks progress reports and/or report cards go home in our manila report card envelopes. These envelopes often include additional information as well. Please make sure that you empty out the contents, sign the appropriate part on the outside, and send the envelope back right away. If you have any questions or would like to hear back from a specific teacher, you can write notes and put them inside the envelope for the teacher. The homeroom teacher receiving the envelopes always looks inside for notes and gets them to the appropriate staff member.

**Website** – Will continue to be under construction throughout the fall semester. We are going through every link, updating content and deleting some items that are over 15 years old. Please contact the school if you have any specific questions regarding information on the website as it may be under revision.

**Microsoft Migration** – The entire Aurora School District is undergoing a major Microsoft update that will replace email systems and support other server needs. Columbia is due to "migrate" to the new system the second week of November. However, district wide we have experienced issues receiving and sending from outside email sources. If you have regularly received emails from Columbia staff or as part of the automated message system and this suddenly stops, please contact via phone those parties to let them know so it can be fixed.

# Mensaje del Director

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Saludos a las familias y miembros de la comunidad de Columbia,

Tuvimos una fiesta pirata muy divertida y mojada con hula-hulas (“hula-hoops”) y tirando canastas de baloncesto para celebrar la venta de recaudación de fondos. Los alumnos ganaron premios en base a los artículos que vendieron, y también ganaron la oportunidad de ganarse dinero en efectivo al meter canastas de baloncesto, jugando bingo, participando en el concurso de hula-hula, aventando globos llenos de agua y algunos obtuvieron un pase “Cougar” de Columbia. Por supuesto, la diversión fue mayor para los estudiantes que participaron en la actividad de “tirar al agua al Sr. Hamilton” (“Flush Mr. Hamilton”), en la cual terminé muy mojado. Fue un gran día para una fiesta y los niños se divirtieron mucho. Nuestra recaudación de fondos resultará en aproximadamente \$8,000 para el PTSO, y será gastado durante el año para beneficio de los niños.

**Seguridad** – Hemos tenido algunos problemas con algunos adultos y nuestros estudiantes en el vecindario. El viernes, 17 de septiembre mandamos a los hogares una carta que explicaba un incidente que creó una alerta sobre un extraño. Este asunto está relacionado con otra serie de mensajes que he recibido por correo electrónico de padres de familia con inquietudes específicamente sobre la esquina de las calles Columbia Ave. y Bethany Cir. en la parte norte de Columbia, y también en el parque El Dorado. Nosotros pedimos a los estudiantes irse a casa todos los días después de escuela, pero hay un grupo de estudiantes que pasa tiempo en esa esquina y en el parque. Esto es peligroso y manda un mensaje negativo a la comunidad sobre los estudiantes de secundaria y su comportamiento. Por favor ayúdenos al asegurarse de que su estudiante va directamente a la casa todos los días a menos de que estén participando en alguna actividad o deporte supervisado por un miembro del personal de Columbia. Estaremos trabajando con el departamento de seguridad del distrito y con el Departamento de Policía de Aurora para dispersar de estas áreas a estos estudiantes. Hemos pedido, guiado y caminado con estos estudiantes diariamente sin ver ningún cambio en sus acciones, así que hablaremos formalmente con las familias empezando el 1ro de octubre.

**Lecciones los martes** – Este año hemos añadido una lección de liderazgo que dura 30 minutos y es implementada los martes durante el Periodo 3, conocido por los niños como “homeroom”. Estas lecciones han incluido información sobre la intimidación, integridad, perseverancia, el respeto y recientemente una lección sobre la excelencia, acompañada de la presentación del discurso presidencial dirigido a los estudiantes de toda la nación. Estamos muy emocionados sobre este tiempo dedicado a las lecciones y sobre nuestro plan de implementar un programa sobre la intimidación para los estudiantes al igual que el desarrollo de la iniciativa de diversidad e igualdad.

**Desayuno** – Empezamos a servir desayuno el 13 de septiembre. Las puertas en el lado este de la cafetería abren a las 6:50 AM y cierran a las 7:00 en punto. Los niños pueden comer de 6:50 a 7:10 AM. Información sobre esto fue mandada a las casas por medio del sistema telefónico automatizado, el boletín mensual y en el sobre de reporte de progreso. El desayuno NO es servido los martes debido al comienzo tarde de clases.

**Sobres de reportes de progreso** – Cada cuatro semanas y media mandamos a los hogares reportes de progreso en los sobres grandes de color madera/café (sobre “manila”). Estos sobres ocasionalmente contienen información adicional también. Por favor asegúrese de vaciar el sobre, firmar en la línea indicada en la parte de afuera, y mande el sobre de regreso inmediatamente. Si usted tiene preguntas o le gustaría hablar con un maestro específicamente, usted puede escribir una nota y meterla dentro del sobre para el/la maestro/a. El maestro de “homeroom” que recibe los sobres siempre se fija adentro del sobre para buscar notas y se las entrega al miembro del personal apropiado.

**Página de Internet** – Continuaremos re-construyendo nuestra página de internet durante el semestre de otoño. Estamos revisando todos los enlaces, actualizando el contenido y borrando algunas piezas de información que tienen más de 15 años. Por favor comuníquese con la escuela si usted tiene preguntas específicas referentes a la información en la página de Internet que puede estar incorrecta y tiene que ser corregida.

**Migración del programa Microsoft** – El distrito escolar entero está renovando el programa Microsoft que reemplazará el sistema de correo electrónico y proveerá apoyo a otras necesidades tecnológicas. Columbia tendrá su propia migración al nuevo sistema la segunda semana de noviembre. Sin embargo, el distrito entero ha experimentado problemas mandando y recibiendo correos electrónicos a direcciones fuera del distrito. Si usted ha recibido correos del personal de Columbia regularmente o por parte del sistema automatizado de comunicación de asistencia y de repente dejó de recibirlos, por favor comuníquese por teléfono con las personas necesarias y déjeles saber para poder arreglar el problema.

## Reminder: Withdrawing Students from Columbia and Address Changes

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When withdrawing your student from Columbia, please let the registrar (Mrs. Morin in counseling) know at least 24 hours in advance of the withdrawal. The parent/guardian needs to sign a withdrawal form in the counseling office. The students on their last day, are then responsible to take a withdrawal sheet around to their classrooms, media center, cafeteria, and nurse for signatures. They must also clean out their hall locker and PE locker (if applicable).

If you have recently moved or are planning on moving, please contact Mrs. Morin in counseling. In order to update address in our database, we will need verification of your new address. Examples of verification are:

- Copy of lease or closing statement that has parent's name and address listed.
- Xcel Energy bill or phone bill with parent's name and new address.



# Message from the Attendance Office

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School attendance should be a priority for all students and parents. We would like to remind you how important it is for students to be in school every day.

We ask that you speak to your child regarding any missed class time and ensure that your child attends every class, on time, every day. Please contact us for absences such as illness, injury and appointments, as well as other absences which must be approved by both the parent/guardian and the principal to be regarded as excused. If a student's absence is not caused by illness or injury, or approved by the school principal, the absence shall be considered unexcused.

Your support and cooperation in this matter are essential. We want to work with you to ensure that your child attends classes, every day, on time.

Below please find our policy regarding attendance responsibilities.

## **Students: Practice and maintain Cougar P.R.I.D.E.**

1. Attend school for all days of the school year.
2. The first bell at 7:10 AM and you must be in class at 7:20 AM, prepared for academic work.
3. Contact teachers immediately upon returning from an absence to receive make-up assignments and deadlines for completing them.
4. Complete work as assigned by the teacher when a pre-arranged absence is required.
5. Follow the proper procedures for arriving at school late or leaving school early. Sign-in at the main office when arriving after 7:30 AM. Sign-out at the main office only if excused to leave early through the main office or nurse. Students may not excuse themselves.

(Times apply for Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday)

## **Parents: Support, teach, and model Cougar P.R.I.D.E.**

1. Ensure the student is attending school every day.
2. Communicate with the student regarding attendance.
3. For suspensions or extended absences longer than 3 days, request make-up assignments.
4. Monitor school work through: <https://sis.aps.k12.co.us/campus/portal/aurora.jsp>
5. Provide the school with all current and accurate phone numbers for contact during the school day. This is essential especially in cases of emergency. Students whose parents do not provide accurate information may be asked to not return to school until a working and accurate phone number is given.
6. Be available to come to school when student is sick or disciplinary action requiring student pick-up has occurred. This includes leaving work if necessary.

# Please, DO NOT Park or Drop off/Pick up Students in Staff Parking Lot

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We need to ask parents not to park, or drop off and/or pick up students in the staff parking lot located on the south side of the building. If you are visiting our building you will need to park on the street. If parents drop off or pick up students by driving through the lot, it creates a safety issue. These directions are clearly posted on the signs at the entrance of the lot.

# Columbia's McTeacher Night

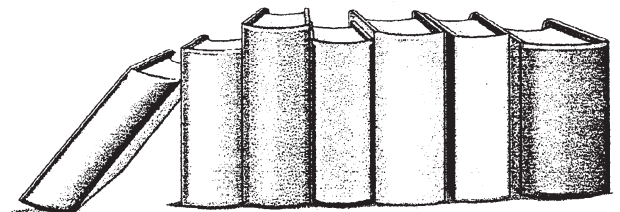
