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## Principal's Message

Columbia Community,

We are into our last several weeks of the school year and have many exciting family activities available for everyone. Please see the different evening events planned throughout the rest of the year including the co-ed soccer and girls' basketball games, music concerts and more! One of these evenings will be our spring open house on May 1, 2014 from 6 – 8 PM. During the evening we will have information regarding 5th Block, 5th Grade Parent Night, and other programs. We look forward to seeing you this spring.

6th and 7th grade students, along with incoming 5th graders will register for their classes for the fall when we return from Spring Break. Due to continued funding limitations and staff reductions, the only elective choices for the fall include Chorus, Band and Orchestra. Students not interested in these will be assigned to our art, physical education or drama programs. If you have any questions, please contact our counseling secretary, Mrs. Morin.

Along with scheduling, I'd like to explain some specific changes regarding next year due to continuing budget cuts through the district and state which have further reduced our number of staff. Next year, students who need additional support in the areas of reading, math and English language development will continue to get this support on a limited basis; however, it will be scheduled in-place of one of their elective classes. Our primary responsibility is to get every student up to or above grade level in the areas of reading, writing and math.

Cyber bullying is an area that all parents and schools should be aware of and understand. It happens in many forms today with the available technologies of cell phones, email, instant messaging and social networks such as Facebook. As a school, we have very specific computer access policies and specific restrictions on any home electronics intended to keep students from accessing the items above and learning in a safe environment. However, away from school, students can use cell phones and computers to "bully" others or be bullied by others. Some simple tips that all parents can use include having computer access at home in a visible location such as the kitchen where a parent can monitor. Also, there are computer programs available that give parents the ability to restrict website access and review what your child accessed on the internet. Finally, cell phone companies can make available to parents reports of the content of sent and received text messages. At school, when a parent brings forward a concern, please know that we will always refer the information to the police since these are your personal items. Keeping an active eye on what you allow your child to access is the best way to create positive accountability.

# Mensaje del Director

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Comunidad de Columbia,

Estamos cursando las últimas semanas del año escolar y tenemos muchas actividades familiares disponibles para todos. Por favor vea los diferentes eventos planeados por la tarde para el resto del año incluyendo los partidos de fútbol soccer y basquetbol femenino, conciertos de música y ¡mucho más! Uno de los eventos planeados será nuestra noche de puertas abiertas en primavera la noche del 1ro de mayo de 2014, de 6 a 8. Durante esa noche tendremos información sobre las clases de verano conocidas como la 5ta Sesión, o en inglés: "5th Block", información para padres de estudiantes en 5to grado que asistirán a Columbia el próximo año, e información de otros programas. Esperamos verlos esta primavera.

Los alumnos en 6to y 7mo grados, junto con los estudiantes de 5to grado se registraran para las clases del próximo otoño cuando regresemos del receso de primavera. Debido a nuestras continuas limitaciones de fondos y reducciones de personal docente, las únicas opciones de clases optativas para el otoño serán las clases de canto, banda y orquesta. Los estudiantes que no estén interesados en esas clases serán asignados a nuestros programas de arte, educación física y drama. Si usted tiene preguntas, por favor comuníquese con nuestra secretaria del departamento de consejería, la Sra. Morin.

En alineación con la disponibilidad de clases, quiero explicar algunos cambios específicos sobre el próximo año debido a los recortes de presupuesto por todo el distrito y el estado, los cuales han reducido aun más el número de empleados. El próximo año, los estudiantes que necesiten apoyo adicional en las áreas de lectura, matemáticas y desarrollo del idioma inglés continuaran recibiendo ese apoyo en base limitada, pero las clases serán asignadas en lugar de una de sus clases optativas. Nuestra responsabilidad primaria es el de llevar a todo estudiante a estar a un nivel de grado o más avanzado en las áreas de lectura, escritura y matemáticas.

La intimidación cibernética es un área que todos los padres y las escuelas deben de conocer y entender. Esto es algo que pasa de muchas maneras hoy en día con la disponibilidad de tecnología en los teléfonos celulares, correo electrónico, mensajes instantáneos y redes sociales tales como Facebook. Como escuela, tenemos reglamento muy específico para el acceso a computadoras y restricciones específicas para cualquier artículo electrónico que traen de casa, con toda la intención de evitar que los estudiantes tengan acceso a los medio de comunicación ya mencionados, y que puedan aprender en un ambiente seguro. Sin embargo, fuera de la escuela, los alumnos pueden usar teléfonos celulares y computadoras para "intimidar" a otros o a ser intimidados por otros. Un consejo simple que los padres pueden usar es el tener acceso a una computadora en casa en un lugar visible tal como la cocina, donde un padre de familia puede monitorear. También, hay programas de computadora disponibles que dan a los padres la habilidad de restringir acceso a páginas de internet y pueden también revisar a qué ha tenido acceso en el internet. Finalmente, las compañías de teléfonos celulares pueden hacer disponibles a los padres, el contenido de los mensajes de texto mandados y recibidos. En la escuela, cuando los padres mencionan alguna inquietud, por favor sepa que siempre vamos a referir la información a la policía ya que estos son artículos personales de ustedes. Poner atención a lo que su hijo(a) tiene acceso es la mejor manera de crear responsabilidad positiva.

## Fifth Block Offered May 2014

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Aurora Public Schools offers a voluntary Fifth Block of Instruction for students who have shown academic growth during the school year and who could benefit most from additional learning time in math and literacy. Priority is given to students who are not proficient in both literacy and math, both unsatisfactory and partially proficient.

Invitations will be offered to incoming second through incoming tenth graders who are not yet proficient but demonstrate evidence of growth. Fifth Block also includes incoming fourth graders who are low proficient in reading and incoming sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth graders who are low proficient in math. Students must have had continuous enrollment in APS for at least one year (March to March) consistent attendance and overall good behavior.

Fifth Block is provided to students at no additional cost to parents. Students are generally taught in their own schools using district curriculum. Class size is set at a 25 to 1 ratio.

The regular school year runs from August 6, 2013 – May 21, 2014. The Fifth Block of Instruction will be offered from May 27, 2014 to June 26, 2014 for the 2013-14 school year.

School staff will notify parents of eligible students from March 3, 2014 to April 4, 2014, and parents must return signed contracts to accept participation of their child in Fifth Block no later than April 11, 2014.

Transportation, breakfast/lunch and nursing services will be available to students. There will be no need to reapply for free or reduced lunch.

## Fifth Block se ofrece en mayo de 2014

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El distrito escolar de las Escuelas Públicas de Aurora (Aurora Public Schools, o APS) ofrece la sesión "Fifth Block of Instruction" (Quinta Sesión de Instrucción), en la cual la inscripción es de forma voluntaria, para los alumnos que han demostrado progreso académico durante el ciclo escolar y que son los que más podrían beneficiarse de tiempo adicional de aprendizaje en matemáticas y alfabetización. Se le da prioridad a los alumnos que no han alcanzado la competencia en ambas materias de alfabetización y matemáticas, las dos de nivel insatisfactorio y parcialmente competente.

Se ofrecen invitaciones a los alumnos que ingresarán del segundo al décimo grado, que todavía no alcanzan el nivel de competencia, pero que muestran evidencia de crecimiento. Fifth Block también incluye a los alumnos que ingresarán al cuarto grado y que están a un nivel de competencia bajo en lectura y a los alumnos que ingresarán al sexto, séptimo, octavo, noveno y décimo grado y que están a nivel bajo de competencia en matemáticas. Los alumnos deben haber estado matriculados continuamente en APS por lo menos durante un año (desde marzo hasta el siguiente marzo), haber asistido a clases en forma regular y haber tenido una buena conducta en general.

Fifth Block se proporciona a los alumnos sin ningún costo adicional para los padres. Los alumnos generalmente reciben la enseñanza en sus propias escuelas usando el plan de estudios del distrito. El tamaño de la clase se establece en una proporción de 25 alumnos por cada maestro.

El año escolar regular es del 6 de agosto de 2013 al 21 de mayo de 2014. La sesión Fifth Block of Instruction se ofrecerá del 27 de mayo al 26 de junio para el año escolar 2013-2014.

El personal escolar notificará a los padres de los alumnos que se recomienda que asistan, desde el 31 de marzo de 2014 hasta el 4 de abril de 2014, y los padres tienen que notificar a la escuela para confirmar la participación de sus hijos en Fifth Block no más tarde del 11 de abril de 2014.

Habrán servicios de transporte, desayuno/almuerzo y enfermería, disponibles para los alumnos. Los padres no tendrán que solicitar nuevamente las comidas gratuitas o de precio reducido.
